

What is the Bible?


The Bible is a library of books containing different styles of writing.

The Bible is made up of chapters and verses.

The first five books of the Bible is called the "Pentateuch" but it is also known as the "Torah."

The first five books are:

- Genesis
- Exodus
- Leviticus
- Numbers
- Deuteronomy





Why Is the Bible Important to Christians?

Christians believe the Bible is the Word of God. It is their sacred text.

The Bible contains laws for living according to God's rules and advice for living well.

The Bible tells the story of Jesus and the early church.





There are different styles of writing in the Old Testament.

Psalm- a sacred song or hymn

Prayer- communicating with God


Story- an account of events

Proverb- something that expresses truth

Prophecy- a prediction of what will happen in the future

If you have a Bible at home, you may wish to look at the different styles of writing.





Let's take a look at Psalm 18: 1-4

I love you, LORD, my strength.

The LORD is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.

I called to the LORD, who is worthy of praise, and I have been saved from my enemies.

The cords of death entangled me; the torrents of destruction overwhelmed me.



Let's take a look at the prophecy in Isaiah 11:1-5

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD and he will delight in the fear of the LORD.

He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; but with righteousness he will judge the needy,

with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth.

He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth;

with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. Righteousness will be his belt

and faithfulness the sash around his waist.



Let's take a look at Proverbs 3:5-6

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.
